14. The Passover was, as we have seen, (No. 11, above), preeminently a type of Christ and his redemption, received by feeding upon him through faith. He, therefore, connected immediately with it the institution of the *Lord's supper*; using the unleavened bread of the Passover to represent his flesh, and one of the cups of wine to represent his blood—both given for the life of the world. Thus the Passover, which had for so many ages *foreshadowed* his sacrifice for the sin of the world, gave place to the Christian ordinance which *commemorates* that great event. P. 604.
